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Including a photo in your CV improves your chances

A professional, up-to-date photo can be neutral or slightly positive—but only if it fits the business context. Outdated or casual images can hurt your chances. In some countries (like the UK or US), photos are discouraged to avoid bias.

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Are cover letters still needed?

Only when requested. In many cases, especially with high application volumes, long cover letters may not be read. If used, keep it short and relevant.

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"Recruiters don't like questions" – Not true.

Asking questions shows interest, preparation, and professionalism. Staying silent can suggest a lack of engagement.



Talking about salary is taboo?

Not at all. Discussing compensation is normal – just approach it openly and consider the full offer, not just the salary.
